## Five Paths of Student Engagement – Positive Ways Forward Beyond the Pandemic

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Engagement is the new frontier of student achievement. Across the world, between a third and a quarter of students say they are bored. In secondary schools, similar proportions say they have no meaning or purpose in life. But there's more to getting students' engaged than just battling boredom by trying harder, or using our imaginations as educators.
